  - (2) 21 minutes per presentation (7 mins. presentation time, 7 mins. translation, 7 mins Q&A)
  - (3) Presentation language can be either Japanese or English
  - (4) Each presenter will have a designated interpreter
  - (5) A meeting will be held with the presenters and interpreters on the first day of the seminar (March 3)
  - (6) Please prepare presentation materials (1-page outline)
  - (7) It is possible to present with a projector (Video Powerpoint etc.)
- 4. Presentation examples:
  - Why you started budo. Training conditions in your home country.
  - Your image of budo, what you hope to achieve, what you think of training, especially when comparing your own country with Japan, gaps in perception etc.
  - How your impressions of budo have changed over the years (satisfaction, disappointments, hopes etc.)
  - What you would like to say to the budo world in Japan.
